Communication and Language

There will be opportunities for the children to listen and speak to the adults and peers through circle time and through play.

Reading, Phonics and Handwriting

- Continue to develop early reading skills through use of phonics, particularly new digraphs when reading at school and home
- Continue to learn tricky words through phonic sessions and words sent home
