Nut-free School



If you are new to the school you may not know that we are

a 'nut-free school'. This means that no products containing nuts are allowed in school. This is due to children with air-borne nut allergies for whom contact with the product could be very dangerous. We appreciate your cooperation with this.

School Uniform

A polite reminder that all children should be wearing a navy blue sweatshirt or cardigan, white polo shirt and black skirt/trousers as well as black shoes. We are aware that some rooms can be chilly due to open windows but please ensure your child is wearing the correct uniform. PE kit should be not obviously branded and be plain black, grey or navy please.

Smart Watches

Some children are wearing Smart Watches to school. This type of device is considered by the school to be similar to a mobile phone and therefore is not allowed in school. Any device which has the capability to call or message a person, access the internet or can take photographs, video or sound recording is not allowed for reasons of safeguarding. Even the V-Tech type watches can be used to take photographs and video. Unfortunately, we have had occasions where children have tried to take photographs of children and adults in school and I'm sure you can appreciate why this is problematic. Any mobile phones brought into school must be kept in the child's bag before they enter the school gates and must be kept switched off, and in their bag, the whole time. If a child is seen with such a device on school premises it will be confiscated and can be collected by an adult from the school office.

Traffic Outside School

I am receiving increasing numbers of complaints from parents and residents about people continuing to drive their cars up to the front of the school in order to drop their children off or pick them up. This is dangerous. There is not enough room to manoeuvre safely during crowded times where young children are around. Please do not risk accidents for the sake of convenience.

- Do not drive into Lethbridge Road at the front of the school
- Do not park your car on the corners of Avenue Road and Lethbridge Road – this causes traffic problems and is dangerous for pedestrians
- Do not drive your car up the alleyway at the back of the houses to drop your child off to reception classes – this is very dangerous
- If you have an agreement to use the staff car park, due to your or your child's disability, please wait until all the parents and their children have cleared the area before trying to leave or enter
- Be aware that the speed limit on Avenue Road is 20mph
