School attendance – attendance at school is very important for your child's further life chances. Days off soon add up to a great deal of lost education. If your child has a 90% attendance rate over their time in school this actually adds up to the equivalent of a whole year of education missed. When children miss school, they miss out on learning which in turn makes it more difficult for them to want to attend. They also of course miss out on social times with friends and this makes it more difficult for them to maintain those relationships. We know that it is not always easy to get your child to school but there is a lot of support here from school staff including our ELSA, Ms Power, and our attendance officer, Mrs Owen. Please work with us to ensure your child's attendance is good.

Similarly, being 10 minutes late each day adds up to 7 days of school missed over the year or 35 lessons missed!

If your child is ill and will not be attending school you should call the school (535033) and leave a message. You need to call every day that your child is out unless we already know from you that the child has an illness that will require a certain amount of days off school, such as Chicken Pox. We need to have identified the reason for your child's absence and ensure they are safe by 9.20am each morning for safeguarding reasons.
