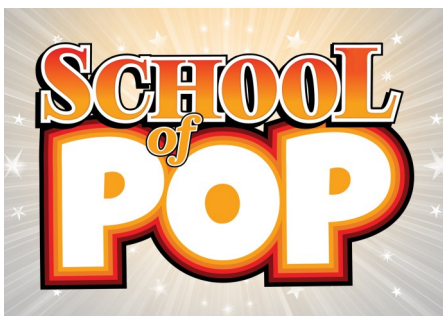
~The Year Six Production~

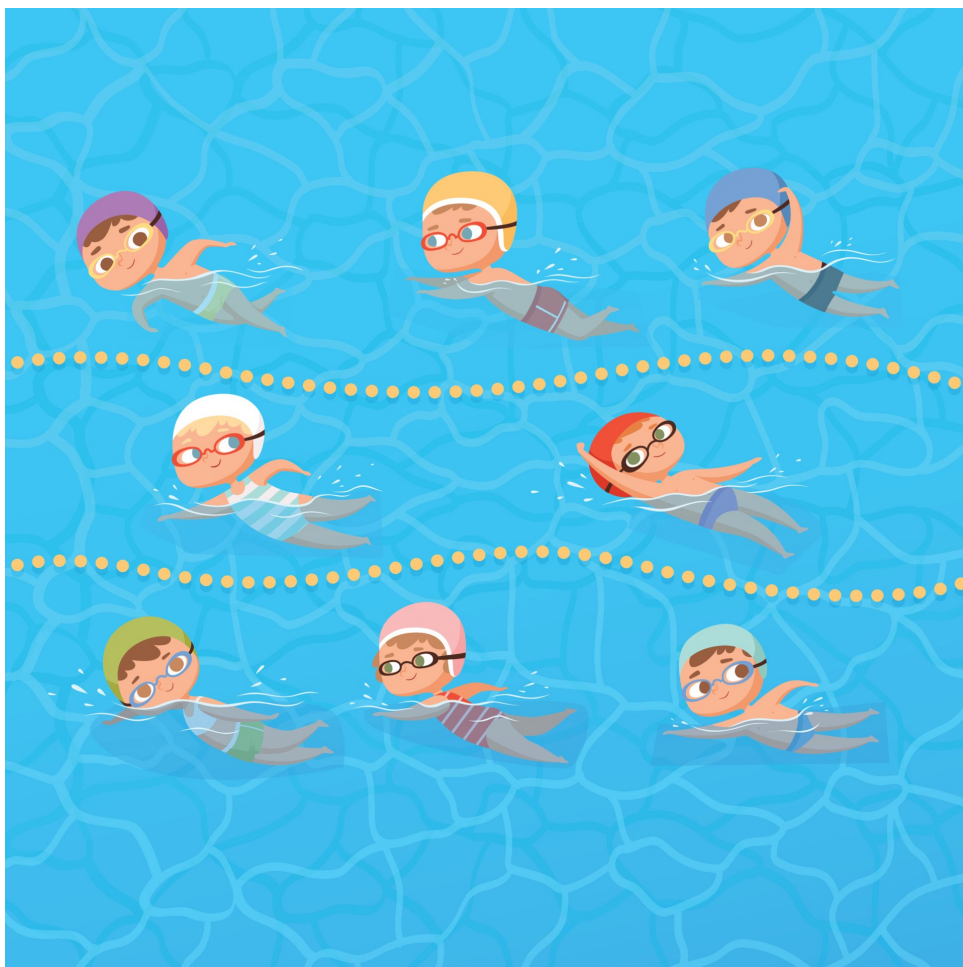

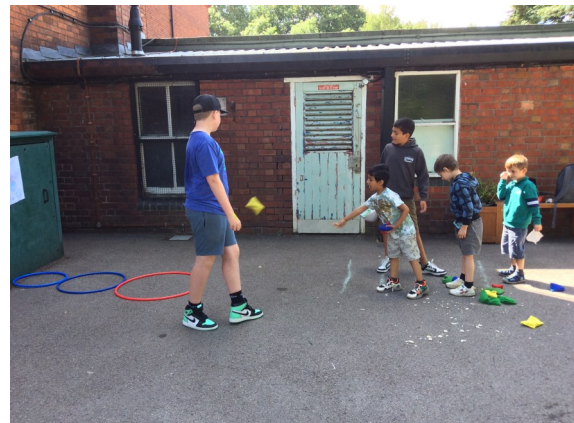




Charity Fundraiser Day

BLUEBERRY SMOOTHIE LOLLIES

Serves: 4 prep time: 10 minutes freezing time: 3 hours

INGREDIENTS

*225g blueberries

*400ml Greek yogurt

*2 tbsp runny honey

METHOD

1. Put all of the ingredients in a liquidizer and blend until smooth.
2. Divide between four disposable plastic cups or moulds and transfer to the freezer for 1 hour.
3. Insert a lolly stick into the centre of each one and freeze for a further 2 hours or until solid.
4. Dip the outside of each cup briefly in hot water to unmould before serving.
